What is Dyslexia?

- It interrupts language based learning: spelling, reading, writing.
- it affects 1 in 5 people, boys and girls equally, and persists throughout life
- it makes it difficult for a student to succeed academically in the typical instructional environment, and it can qualify a student for special education, special accommodations, or extra support services.
- It is treatable with the right kind of learning environment
