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Our Mission...

The mission of the Children's Dyslexia Center - Southern Illinois is to provide free, one-on-one instruction to children who struggle with reading, writing, and spelling by first training tutors to use a highly effective method of teaching.

What are the Requirements for becoming a tutor?

- Passion for helping children
- Bachelor's Degree in any field
- Completed application process (includes an interview)
- Love of reading
- Completion of our International Multisensory Structural Language Education Council (IMSLEC) accredited training program
 - 5 hours observing experienced tutors
 - 70 hours of classroom instruction
 - 100 hour supervised practicum, which takes a minimum of 9 months to complete
 - During the practicum, each scholar must conduct 55-minute tutoring sessions for two children, individually, two times per week (totaling four sessions per week.)
 - There is preparation time for each lesson, as well as time devoted to assigned readings, book reports, exams, and a final project/portfolio to be submitted before certification.
- Purchase of supplies and background check fee (Approx. \$200)
- Potential for employment once certification is completed dependent on need and budget.

Note: The (IMSLEC) accredited training program, which is typically \$5,000, is currently FREE to the trainees.

The Approach we use:

The curriculum used for tutoring and tutor training at all Children's Dyslexia Centers is based on the Orton-Gillingham approach. This approach, developed in 1920's, uses a sequential, multisensory phonetic approach to teaching and spelling. Thus, a variety of sensory data is used to help children understand the written word.
